

#### **Harald Zielinski**

Chief of Security and Environmental Management, Lufthansa Cargo AG

Harald Zielinski was born in Frankfurt on 24 October 1957. In 1974, after completing his secondary education, he enrolled at the Police Academy in the state of Hessen. For the next 14 years, he served as a police officer, mainly at Frankfurt Airport, where he specialized in airline security and was also trained as Chief Negotiator in skyjacking and hostage incidents.

Harald Zielinski joined Lufthansa in October 1988 and worked initially in Corporate Security, where he was responsible for aviation security in the United States, the UK and Eastern Europe, as well as for general airfreight security issues.

In 1994 he set up a dedicated Freight Security department and the following year was appointed as Head of Cargo Security. Four years later, he assumed the position of General Manager Valuable Cargo Services at Lufthansa Cargo.

With effect from 1 December 2003 Harald Zielinski took over the position as Head of Security and Risk Prevention Management at Lufthansa Cargo. At that post he is responsible for the worldwide security measures of Lufthansa Cargo. Since 1 July 2008 he is also responsible for the environmental management.
